

The objectives of the Workshop are twofold: ~~first~~ elaborate proposals for the design and implementation of incentive measures as contemplated in decision V/15; ~~second~~ formulate recommendations to the Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and

Technological Advice (SBSTTA) on an action plan on future cooperation. The results of the workshop will be submitted to the consideration of the seventh meeting of the SBSTTA, on 12-16 November 2001.

The main purpose of proposals for the design and implementation of incentive measures is to assist Parties in developing practical policies and projects leading to the development and implementation of social, economic and legal incentives for the conservation and sustainable use of biological diversity, consistent with the basic objective of the programme of work set out in paragraph 1 of the decision V/15. The proposals would provide technical guidance to policy makers, decision makers and managers with responsibilities covering biodiversity management, whether in national or local government, non-governmental organizations or other organizations, on ways of developing and implementing incentives in order to contribute to the conservation and sustainable use of biological diversity.

The Workshop is also invited to make recommendations to SBSTTA on elements of an action plan for future cooperation to assist Parties in the development of incentive measures. Such an action plan could involve a number of international organisations, whether global or regional, and include elements relating to public education and awareness raising activities, capacity-building and financing.

On the basis of nominations received from Governments, the Executive Secretary has invited experts to participate in the workshop. Experts were selected on the basis of the following criteria:

1. Demonstrated expertise and experience with respect to the social, economic, as well as legal dimensions of the development of incentive measures economics, social sciences and biological diversity;
2. Balanced geographical distribution between and within regions;
3. Gender balance

Competent international organizations, NGOs and stakeholders were invited to designate representatives to participate in the workshop as observers.

The Annex to this Notification lists government nominated experts and observers invited to participate in the Workshop.
